

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Presentataion of Colors

Confer with ex-servicemen in your church regarding a color guard to present the colors. At the time you wish to begin the service, step to the platform and request everyone to stand for the presentation of colors. The color guard will then come from the rear of the auditorium, bearing the national flag and the Christian flag. When the flags are placed in their stands, the congregation may be asked to give appropriate flag salutes.

Music: A drum roll is an appropriate background for such a presentation.

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New 50 Star Flag

If your church does not already have one, purchase a 50-star flag to present to the church on this day. Sunday school pupils can raise the funds for this project. (Check your Christian flag at the same time. Perhaps it would be well to replace it with a new one, too.)

Marching-Fatigue Check

See how many have been faithful in their pledge to attend every Sunday. Post the names of the faithful ones on a large honor roll headed, "Not Suffering from Marching Fatigue." If necessary, add another incentive for perfect attendance during the campaign.

Roving Reporter

Begin the service with a roving reporter asking the following questions (and others you may wish to add):

- 1) Who signed the Declaration of Independence first? (John Hancock)
- 2) What two words were recently added to our pledge to the American flag? (Under God).
- 3) On what four freedoms is our way of life based? (Freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom from want, freedom from fear.)
- 4) How many times has the Constitution of the U.S. been amended? (22)
- 5) From what famous speech are these words taken: "And the government of the people, and for the people shall not perish from the earth"? (Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg address)

(Make the questions easier for younger departments.)

The Minutemen

Ready for service at a minute's notice.

They never went to bed in their low ceiling, plain little bedrooms without laying out their clothes and their guns, powder-horns and bullets within reach. In a minute they could be dressed, down stairs and out of the house, ready to fight.

Bands of "minutemen" were organized to meet any attack by Kings troops. Late in the night of April 18, 1775, British General Gage sent out a thousand men under Major Pitcairn to seize colonial supplies of powder at Concord, about 20 miles from Boston. But the patriots had learned of the plan. Paul Revere and William Dawes, riding by different routes, warned the countryside that the British were coming. When Pitcairn reached Lexington, in the early dawn, he found a company of about 70 minutemen drawn up on the common to dispute his passage. He ordered the "rebels" to disperse. A shot was fired by some unknown soldier. It was the signal for a volley from the British, which killed eight of the minutemen. Pitcairn's troups marched on to Concord. There, at the bridge, they were met and turned back by the "embattled farmers" who had gathered from the near-by towns. During the long, hot afternoon the British retreated toward Boston. They were hit by a deadly fire from behind trees and stone walls. When at last they reached Charlestown, they had lost nearly 300 men. news of Lexington and Concord was swiftly carried by Paul Revere to the colonies southward. New England was in a ferment. Farmers took their old flintlock and hastened to join the militia surrounding Boston. They came not only from Massachusetts but from New Hampshire, Connecticut, and Rhode Island as well. Within a few days an unorganized army of sixteen thousand men held Gage besieged in Boston. This was the beginning of the "minutemen" and of the Revolutionary War which was to bring a great country her freedom and establish the United States as a nation.

The minutemen in their every day work clothes were quite a contrast to the well-cut scarlet uniforms and flashing buttons of the British troops... This reminds one of the story of David and Goliath...

You'd heard all the other poems . . . the dull ones, the dry ones.
Then one day the teacher started to read a special one you'd never forget.
"Listen, my children, and you shall hear of the midnight ride of Paul Revere."

And--it was good! Good as a story!

There was all the secret stuff about the muffled oars and the lanterns in Old North
Church. Then the horse leapt. The sparks flew. The schoolroom shook to a thunderous knocking till you wanted to grab your musket and run right to Lexington, yourself.

That's the FAMOUS ride, the one everyone knows about.

But there were dozens of others along black roads in the driving rain.

Dozens of others where Paul carried messages that would have proved him patriot or traitor . . . depending on who caught him.

What drove this stocky, middle-aged man to be always in the thick of things . . . to be courier, organizer, warrior, pleader and plotter? He couldn't have told you. He wasn't a great hand with words--as were Patrick Henry and the clever Mr. Franklin.

But he couldn't stomach injustice any more than they could. He never could as long as he lived. In his seventies there was Paul making plates to sheathe "Old Ironsides."

Paul knew the fight against injustice never falters, never relaxes. His life proved . . . and proves over and over again . . . that "in the hour of darkness and peril and need, the people will waken and listen to hear . . . the midnight message of Paul Revere."

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Our Religious Heritage

In 1620 the Pilgrims, and from 1628 on the Puritans came to find freedom to worship God as their conscience required. The Quakers came from England by the thousands. There hundreds had been imprisoned. Many had died a martyr's death. To New Jersey, to Delaware, and to Pennsylvania came these quakers, and they founded prosperous towns amid cultivated acres of rich farm land, under guaranties of a freedom unknown to them at home. The freedom they gained, they granted, and this liberty attracted shiploads of Germans; Lutherans, Mennonites, Dunkers, Moravians, and Schwenkfeldians. These Germans came to escape starvation and persecution, and found in the colonies opportunity to live and worship. All along the coast of the Atlantic there came also the Huguenots from France. These hard-working, determined immigrants sought liberty to worship God.

What a heritage is here. What a record of sacrifice for principle, that thousands of simple people, who for the most part could have remained in their homeland by a compromise of their faith, should undertake the dangers of wearisome journeyings and precarious pioneering. All this they risked for the sake of personal liberty, frequently for religious liberty. Here is the origin of the American spirit with its thirst for freedom. What a heritage. This became a right, established by law, when Thomas Jefferson penned:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; that to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their

just powers from the consent of the governed." Thus, there was being established for the first time a nation with two great basic principles of freedom: civil and religious liberty.

Religious liberty is recognized in our country. It is written into our basic laws. It is upheld by our statesmen and jurists. But is is threatened, too. These threats jeopardize those liberties which are based on the gospel of Christ. They jeopardize the religious liberty which is the most precious heritage Americans enjoy today. Let us talk and practice, liberty, and insist, by voice and vote, upon its maintenance for all peoples and beliefs.

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The Spirit of '76

"On through the freezing night went the army of scarecrows. Orders were given in a whisper; muskets were gingerly handled and foot-falls lightly planted." In the winter of 1777 George Washington and his troops straggled into quarters at Valley Forge. The hardships and privations suffered by the soldiers were appalling. One-third, hungry, freezing, unpaid and disgruntled, went AWOL; another third died of wounds, malnutrition and sickness. Those remaining, fired by Washington's determination and leadership, turned hopelessness into hope, and kindled the dying embers of Freedom into a torch of Liberty.

In 1777-78 Americans of every segment of Colonial society whose origins were in dictatorial monarchies of the Old World, rallied at Valley Forge under the Declaration of Independence to continue the fight for freedom and the dignity of man. This valley of the Forge was almost a valley of death for the War of Independence. Their resolute purpose, their belief in God saw them through the despair of that hour.

These determined ragged men backed by their devout womenfolk gave their purses, their prayers, their personal power to the utmost that the flickering candle of the American dream might be shielded from extinction and then flare up as a torch of liberty for the world to see. On the glistening snow of Valley Forge, they willingly sacrificed social position, comfort and their substance that we today might live in freedom.

Their staying power, their refusal to give in to tyranny on this first military training ground of the American Revolution has been an inspiration to peoples of the entire civilized world for nearly two centuries. They were talking freedom, thinking freedom, giving their entire souls to an idea. They knew and the Constitution of the United States later affirmed that the nation was not formed as, or ever to be, a socialist country. They struggled for the building of a Republic with representative government and democratic methods.

At this hour, freedom's future is on the auction block all over the world. The roll call of modern patriots rises larger each day as totalitarian blandishments, subversion and the threats of open war forge the resistance which shapes the faith that makes men free. May we pledge our fidelity to the principles of the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights. These are the tools and weapons of freedom for Americans.

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The Declaration of Independence

July the first, 1776. The hall of the Congress was full, for the underlying reason of Thomas Jefferson's structure in words was under debate. A committee had been appointed, to reduce to proper legal and parliamentary form the sense of what 13 states had approved. There was Benjamin Franklin, grave under his urbanity; John Adams, feeling like a pilot whose ship had skirted past shoal and reef into a harbor mouth; Roger Sherman of Connecticut, Robert Livingston, and the thoughtful syllable and word-weighing Thomas Jefferson of Virginia. The five had met to shape words and build them into sentences, to plane and chamfer and bevel their raw material into a giant, soaring structure whose unadorned splendor would make men in far ends of the world catch their breaths with awe and wonder. The heart of this committee was Thomas Jefferson. Shaping the structure in his mind, mentally he added a story here, sketched out a colonnade there, removed lines from a pediment. His colleague made suggestions slightly altering the shape . . . and the word structure grew. "When in the course of human events it becomes necessary . . . We hold these truths to be sacred and undeniable. . . Why not merely say that we hold them to be self-evident?" These corrections stood.

Farmer John Dickinson spoke out in anguished negative. "My conduct this day will give the finishing blow . . . to my . . . popularity. Yet I had rather forfeit popularity forever, than vote away the blood and happiness of my countrymen . . ." On and on he went, and there could be no doubt of his soul-deep sincerity. Independence was like "destroying our house in winter . . . before we have another shelter." What would all-out war mean? Boston burned, Indians turned loose along the frontiers, and possible ruination of England. By common consent John Adams rose to answer the Pennsylvanian and history must record another "lost speech" to stand beside Abraham Lincoln's. "He came out with a power and thought and expression that moved us from our seats," said the Virginian, Thomas Jefferson.

The debate was ended. The roll call of the states began, the names echoing through the crowded hall: "Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York . . . The reverberation calls that would begin Alabama . . . Arizona . . . Arkansas . . . The old familiar names intermingled forever with those of lands undreamed of in July 1776. Harrison read out the resolutions that had been under debate. He read slowly, giving full weight to each word. "Resolve: that these United States are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States; that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain is, and ought to be, totally dissolved."

Other resolutions followed, and the Declaration was ordered to be duly engrossed on good parchment, since copies were by now scored with deletions, interlineation too confused a jumble for the delegates to sign. Mounted messengers rode out to all points of the compass, their saddlebags bulging with sheets on which the ink was still wet.

NOTE: If time allows - have someone read the second and last paragraph.

Notice that the document declares our independence of England, but our dependence on God!

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FREEDOM CONTEST

The Freedom Contest will graphically demonstrate to your Sunday school a portion of our glorious National Heritage. The fires of patriotism are burning anew throughout our land in response to the threat of world-wide communism. You will find this contest in keeping with the spirit of our day and one which will generate great enthusiasm in your Sunday school. Use your own individuality as a leader in developing the details of the contest. The following are a few ideas to help you:

CONTEST IN BRIEF

The contest poster depicts the ride of Paul Revere from Charleston, * Massachusetts to Lexington, Massachusetts on the night of April 18, 1775. The purpose of his midnight ride was to warn the colonists of the approach of the British troops from Boston. In Longfellow's famous poem "Paul Revere's Ride" the ride began after two signal lanterns were placed in the Old North Church Tower. The distance from Charleston to Lexington was approximately eleven miles.

- A. COMPETITION. You may choose from the following.
 - 1. Three teams. Many Sunday schools prefer to have three teams in competition for added interest and to give the "looser" company.

Checklist: Order three contest posters; one for each team.

Color the Paul Revere rider in keeping with the color of the team. Red, white and blue could be used to go along with the National Heritage theme.

Select a "General" for each team to act as the leader of his forces and start the team's ride of Paul Revere.

2. Two teams.

Checklist: Vorder two contest posters.

Color the Paul Revere rider, using red and white for one team's colors and blue and white for the other.

Select a "General" for each side.

3. One team. If this method is used, the Sunday school as a whole will compete in the effort to reach the goal established for the contest. (Further information is given under Goals.) Individual competition may be encouraged by awarding the persons with the highest points. (See Awards on next page.)

Checklist: Vorder one contest poster for each department or assembly in your Sunday school.

Select a "General" to start the

contest.

B. METHOD. Two means may be used to advance Paul Revere's ride. They are:

*Charleston, Massachusetts, was later incorporated into the city of Boston, but at the time of Paul Revere's ride was a separate community.



- 1. Goals. At the January or February workers' conference, set the over all attendance goal you desire to reach by April 29. Be sure the goal set is obtainable, otherwise it may add discouragement rather than impetus.
 - a. One team. Using this method the entire Sunday school will be working together to reach the goal set. There will be five Sundays of competition. A 10% gain each Sunday will usually help any school meet its objective.

Example:

Sunday School - 100 in average attendance Goal by April 29 - 150 10% increase each Sunday:

> March 25 - 100 April 1 - 110 April 8 - 122 April 15 - 134 April 22 - 147 April 29 - Over 150

Each Sunday's goal can be divided between the classes of your Sunday school. If you have 10 classes and you are attempting to make a gain of 10 in attendance, each class will be given ε goal of 10% increase.

- b. Two or three teams. Establish goals as above, but divide 2 or 3 ways each Sunday between teams rather than classes.
- 2. <u>Points</u>. If you use the point system here are suggested points for the following:

1 point - for each team member present

2 points - for each individual staying for church

5 points - for every new visitor

5 points - for the second Sunday the visitor attends

10 points - for the third Sunday the visitor attends

- C. AWARDS. The awards suggested may be created by someone with artistic ability in your church or you may contact a trophy store.
 - 1. Freedom Meial Honor Award (or trophy) to the team or individual winning the contest.
 - 2. Credo Award for runners up in contest and those contributing "beyond the call of duty." (Make a bookmark labeled "Credo Award for Outstanding Service.")
- D. ADDITIONAL AWARD SUGGESTIONS. You may wish to ask members of your Sunday school to contribute the following in keeping with the contest theme:

- 1. <u>Children</u> Make posters Give GEORGE WASHINGTON FOSTER AWARD for best poster.
- 2. Juniors Write essays Give NATHAN HALE AWARD for best essay.
- 3. <u>High Schoolers</u> Contribute editorials THOMAS JEFFERSON EDITORIAL AWARD for best editorial. (Editorial could be used in church bulletin.)
- 4. Adults Submit appropriate photographs BENJAMIN FRANKLIN PHOTOGRAPHIC AWARD for most appropriate photograph.

The subjects and title suggestions could fit a particular Sunday.

Example: Essay Award may be given on Freedom of Speech Sunday.

The advance of Paul Revere on the contest poster will be figured according to the size of your Sunday school and as to the choice of methods. Use Plasti-Tak* to affix Paul Revere to the poster. If desired the lantern can first be placed in position on the Old North Church Tower and then be used from Sunday to Sunday to indicate the goal to be reached.

Handsome facsimile reproductions of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights and the Declaration of Independence are now available on three pages suitable for framing. MINUTEMEN GARRISON and REDCOAT STOCKADE

This visual aid has been prepared to serve as an <u>attendance holder</u> to follow-up the Freedom Contest and as such is to be used during the six weeks of the "Our Foursquare Heritage" portion of the "Committed to Faithfulness" program.

Too often the new people who attend our Sunday school during a pre-Easter contest are lost immediately after the contest ends. The Minutemen Garrison and Redcoat Stockade* will help you to conserve the gains you have made.

Plan:

- 1) Give each person attending Sunday school (including visitors) on Easter Sunday a minuteman.* (Choose the time and place best suited to your school for this.)
- 2) Ask them to write their name in the prepared space on their minuteman.

 (Write the names of smaller children in for them.)
- 3) Place each minuteman in the "Minutemen Garrison" portion of the poster.
- 4) Urge each minuteman to remain in the Garrison by being present each Sunday throughout the rest of the program.

Your Easter visitors and regular attenders will start off right by having their minuteman placed in the Garrison--no one wants to be captured by the enemy so you can encourage everyone to be in Sunday school next Sunday.

Suggested use for visual:

1) Departmentally

You may wish to use the visual in your departments and if one poster is not large enough to hold all the minutemen, you will need to order others. It is possible to have Garrison #1, Garrison #2, Garrison #3 and so on.

2) Classes

Every member of the class will have his name on a minuteman. When he attends, his minuteman will be placed in the Garrison. When absent, it will be placed in the Stockade. As new visitors attend they will have their names placed on a minuteman.

3) Perfect Attendance

Award classmembers who stay out of the Stockade all six Sundays of the Faithful Emphasis. Those who have perfect attendance may be presented the "Award for Faithfulness"* cards or a Bible plaque. Boys and girls will enjoy an escorted trip to a nearby missle base or military camp.

The following pages contain a suggested pattern for your Worship Services during the Faithful Emphasis. Special reference material entitled "OUR FOURSQUARE HERITAGE" is provided for your use during the <u>Instruction and Visual</u> portion of the worship period. These are quotes from Sister McPherson's book "The Foursquare Gospel" and should be used along with the Program Visual presentation.

These books may be used for additional reference: "The Foursquare Gospel," "This Is That!" and "The Story of My Life." Purchase from the Foursquare Book Shop, 1100 Glendale Boulevard, Los Angeles 26, California.

Since the Faithful Emphasis is a time set aside for spiritual instruction and re-evaluation of the important things for which we stand, we have suggested hymns to create an atmosphere of worship and solemnity with a closing chorus. For additional emphasis on Our Foursquare Heritage also use songs such as:

Preach the Word, Forward March, Preach the Foursquare Gospel, etc.

You will note that excerpts from the DECLARATION OF FAITH are used each week to further substantiate our points of faith. For the best effect it is suggested that these be read in unison. You may mimeograph the necessary portions for your Sunday school members, or if you desire, individual copies may be purchased from the Foursquare Book Shop at 10¢ each.

We need to know WHAT we believe and WHY we believe it. No church can boast of a more fundamental or Biblical doctrinal belief than ours. "COMMITTED TO FAITHFULNESS" gives you an opportunity to thoroughly indoctrinate your school from the youngest in the Nursery class to the eldest in the Adult class.



PART I - Committed to the WORD

I. ORIGINATION OF THE FOURSQUARE GOSPEL.

A. THE FOURSQUARE GOSPEL CAME TO ME BY INSPIRATION.

At a meeting in Oakland, California, the Spirit of God was manifested to a wonderful degree. The great tent, which seated 8,000; was packed, and multitudes were standing around its border. Many had pilgrimaged from afar. Every heart seemed hungry.

The subject was 'The Vision of Ezekiel.' (Ezekiel 1:1-28) My soul was awed! My heart athrill! The blazing glory of that heavenly vision seemed to fill not only the tabernacle but the whole earth.

In the clouds of heaven--which folded and infolded in fiery glory--Ezekiel had beheld the Being whose glory no mortal can describe. As he gazed upon that marvelous revelation of the Omnipotent One, he perceived four faces. The faces--those of a man, a lion, an ox, and an eagle. These four faces were likened unto the four phases of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In the face of the <u>Man</u> we beheld that of the Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief, dying upon the tree.

In the face of the <u>Lion</u> we beheld that of the mighty Baptizer with the Holy Ghost and with fire.

The face of the Ox typified the Great Burdenbearer, who Himself took our infirmities and carried our sicknesses, who in His boundless love and divine provision had met our every need.

In the face of the <u>Eagle</u> we saw reflected soul-enraptured visions of the Coming King, whose pinions soon would cleave the shining heavens, whose silvery voice would set the milky way to echoing as He came to catch His waiting bride away:

A perfect Gospel: A complete Gospel for body, for soul, for spirit, and for eternity. A Gospel that faces squarely in every direction.

In my soul was born a harmony that was struck and sustained upon four full, quivering strings, and from it were plucked words that leaped into being, -- THE FOURSQUARE GOSPEL!

- B. THE FOURSQUARE GOSPEL IS SCRIPTURAL.
 - 1. The Name Foursquare.

The name <u>Foursquare</u> originated with God. It is Scriptural from Exodus, where it is introduced, to Revelation. It flowed like the sweetest honey from the lips of Jehovah when talking to Moses on Mount Sinai. He said, in effect: "The things in the Tabernacle which are immediately concerned with me, Moses, must be foursquare."

The word foursquare is used ten times in the Bible.

In Exodus.....6 times. Ex. 27:1; 28:16; 30:2; 37:25; 38:1; 39:9.

In I Kings.....1 time. I Kings 7:31.

In Ezekiel.....2 times. Eze. 40:47; 48:20.

In Revelation...1 time. Rev. 21:16.

2. God Is Specific Concerning The Foursquareness Of:

His Altar Of Sacrifice. Ex. 27:1.

His Altar Of Incense. Ex. 30:1-2.

The Breastplate On His High Priest. Ex. 28:16.

His Holy Oblation. Eze. 48:20.

- 3. The Four Major Phases Are Scriptural.
 - a. <u>Jesus Christ the Savior of the soul</u>. This is the first major phase. Let us see what "saith the Lord:" Rom. 6:23
 - b. <u>Jesus Christ the Baptizer with the Holy Ghost</u>. This is the second major phase. Let us see what God says in His Book about this: Acts 1:5
 - c. <u>Jesus Christ the Great Physican</u>. This is the third major phase; and we see recorded these words: Matt. 8:17
 - d. <u>Jesus Christ the Coming King</u> is the fourth major phase.
 These are all according to God's Word. Let us see what the Scriptures say about Jesus Christ as the coming King:
 I Thes. 4:16-18





PART III - Committed to the SAVIOR

III. JESUS CHRIST THE SAVIOR - Ezek. 1:4-10



A. FACE OF A MAN.

The first Face that Ezekiel saw was the Face of man. This represents the Lord Jesus Christ as the "Son of man", "the Man Christ Jesus", the "Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief."

The Gospel as pictured by Saint Luke presents the Lord Jesus as the Son of man, the Savior of mankind. Luke wrote to the cultured, educated Greeks, whose ideal seemed to be the developing of a perfect man. Luke shows them the ideal perfect man, in the Lord Jesus Christ, who sacrificed His ideal Self for an ideal.

This is the <u>first phase</u>, or <u>first cardinal doctrine</u>, of the Foursquare Gospel without which no soul can enter into the Kingdom of God or make Heaven his home. This is agreed by all who hold the Truth in righteousness.

B. THE MAN, CHRIST JESUS.

As a Man: He is the "seed of woman" promised in Genesis 3:15, the first promise of a Redeemer for lost humanity. He is the babe born in Bethlehem in a stable, whom the men called wise came to worship.

He is the "Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief" pictured by the great prophet Isaiah (Chapter 53).

He called Himself the Son of man a great many times during His conversations and teachings.

As a Man: He "made himself of no reputation, and took upon himself the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: and being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death even the death of the cross." Phil. 2:7-8

C. JESUS CHRIST - THE SAVIOR.

He is our "Passover Lamb." God's people in Egypt were saved from the death-angel by the substitutionary death of a lamb. Jesus died on the 14th day of Nixan as the priests were preparing to kill the passover lambs. Jesus is the fulfillment of the type, He is our substitute.

We all need a Savior because all have sinned, as it is written in Rom. 3:23.

No matter what one's position or station in life may be, one needs to be born again. Jesus died for all--yea rather, is risen again, and only those names found written in <u>His</u> Book will enter Heaven.

"And whoseever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire." Rev. 20:15

IV. JESUS CHRIST THE GREAT PHYSICIAN.

A. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE OX.

The Ox is the oldest known beast of burden. Since time immemorial the Ox has been used to carry the burdens of mankind. Cattle (which includes oxen) are first mentioned in Genesis 1:25.

Faithful unto death: It is said that the Ox will pull any load, no matter how heavy, and never give up and if the burden be too heavy he will keep pulling until he falls dead from a broken, over-taxed heart. In this he is a type of Jesus Christ our Burden-Bearer.



- B. JESUS CHRIST THE BURDEN BEARER.
 - 1. It was prophesied of Him. Isa. 53:4-5
 - 2. It was fulfilled by Him. Matt. 8:16-17
- C. DIVINE HEALING THROUGHOUT BIBLE.

Every step we take through the Bible has Divine Healing in evidence. Before Jesus came, while He was here, after His ascension, and even to this modern day, for is not "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever?" Let us take a walk and see:

- 1. Old Testament Healing Covenant. "Jehovah Rapha." Ex. 15:26
- 2. New Testament Healing Covenant. James 5:14-16
- 3. Jesus, while He was here, healed all. Matt. 9:35
- Jesus gave healing power to His disciples. Matt. 10:1
- He gave the same power to seventy ordinary followers. Luke 10: 1.9
- 6. After His ascension we read: Acts 5:12,16


V. JESUS CHRIST THE COMING KING.

FACE OF AN EAGLE.

The fourth Face that Ezekiel saw as he stood among the captives by the river of Chebar and saw visions of God, was the Face of an Eagle. "I bare you on eagles' wings, and brought you unto myself." God said to Israel in Exodus 19:4 as He spoke of bringing them up from Egypt to the "Mount of God," Mount Sinai.

The Gospel as pictured by Saint Matthew presents the Lord Jesus Christ as "The King." Writing to the Hebrew nation King, rightful genealogy which begins, "The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David." And then.

which had long looked for their Messiah over the cross the superscription read, "This is Jesus the King of the Jews."



This is the fourth phase of the Foursquare Gospel. The fourth Cardinal Doctrine, the Second Coming of the Lord, which blessed event we eagerly look forward to with anticipation and great joy, knowing that "unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time"; "Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh."

Characteristics Of The Eagle.

The eagle with its piercing gaze that looks into the high lofty heavens...that sights the smallest objects on the earth beneath--

The eagle, that soars in the clouds, descends from dizzy heights and bears its little ones on wide-spread wings, is a striking type of our blessed Coming King, the Lord Jesus Christ.

The eagle is considered the king of birds. He builds his nest in the highest crags, and lines it with down plucked from his own breast...Jesus, our Eagle King, has His home in the highest Heaven and is preparing for us a place purchased at the expense of plucking out His very own life and shedding His blood that we might have a home on High.

- B. JESUS CHRIST THE COMING KING--OLD TESTAMENT.
 - 1. Jacob prophesied His Kingship. Gen. 49:10
 - 2. <u>Isaiah prophesied His Second Advent</u>. Isa. 9:7
 - 3. Jeremiah also heard it from the Lord. Jer. 23:5-6
 - 4. Daniel knew of it, and recorded. Dan. 7:13-14
- C. JESUS CHRIST THE COMING KING--NEW TESTAMENT.

In the 260 chapters of the New Testament the Second Coming of the Lord is referred to 318 times -- more times than there are chapters.

- John the Divine, both in his Gospel and Epistles, speaks in loving terms of the return of his blessed Lord. John 5:28-29 and I John 3:2
- 2. James knew He is coming again. James 5:8
- 3. The Apostle Paul speaks of His Second Advent fifty times, and gives us the perfect word-picture in I Thessalonians 4:13-18.
- 4. Angels explained to a bewildered group of disciples that He would come again, and by what manner. Acts 1:10-11
- 5. <u>Jesus Himself</u>, with His own mouth, declared He would come again. John 14:2-3, Matt. 24:27 and Luke 12:40

Questions.

- 1. What was the fourth face Ezekiel saw? (Eagle)
- 2. How many times in the New Testament is the second coming of Christ referred to? (318)
- 3. What did the angels say to disciples about the second coming of Jesus? (Acts 1:10-11)

Place the face of the Eagle on visual typifying Christ as the Coming King. Key words: ST. MATTHEW, THE KING, COMING KING, ETERNITY, CROWN.


VI. JESUS CHRIST BAPTIZER WITH THE HOLY GHOST.

A. FACE OF A LION.

The second Face that Ezekiel saw in the cloud of grace that folded and infolded in the firmament beneath the fiery throne of God was the Face of a Lion. This represents the Lord Jesus Christ as the "Lion of the tribe of Judah," the all-powerful One, the living, vital Son of the living God.

1. Representation Of Jesus.

As the Lord Jesus is called a Lamb for certain representation, He is called also a Lion. We have a direct scripture which calls Him a Lion: Rev. 5:5.



In prophecy: "Judah is a lion's whelp." Gen. 49:9. Jesus is meant of course, because everything always points to Him who is the culmination of all prophecy. He is from the tribe of Judah, as it is written: Heb. 7:14.

2. A Symbol Of Power.

The <u>lion represents</u> POWER, mighty in strength; the Word of God explains: Prov. 30:30.

When an illustration of great strength was desired, they told of slaying the lion as the acme of physical prowess. Judges 14:5-6, I Samuel 17:34-36 and II Samuel 23:30.

These Scriptural proofs show that the Lion is a symbol of power. Jesus, however, is not called a Lion until after His ascension. (And that is the explanation of the two different lists of the Four Faces as seen and recorded by Ezekiel and John. Ezekiel, looking forward to Calvary sees the Face of a Man, the Saviour, first, while John, on the resurrection side of Calvary, sees the Lion of the tribe of Judah that hath prevailed! Therefore, he lists the Face of a Lion first.)

B. JESUS CHRIST THE BAPTIZER WITH THE HOLY GHOST.

Jesus Christ the Baptizer with the Holy Ghost was heralded by John the Baptist, the forerunner of the Lord. Let us listen to John: Matt. 3:11.

Jesus called the Holy Ghost energy POWER. He pronounced these words as a command with a promise, Luke 24:49.

Jesus reminds them again just before His ascension: Acts 1:5.

The first outpouring on the day of Pentecost to the first group that was waiting for the promise, confirmed the fact that the Holy Ghost had been sent into the world in a new capacity. It does not mean, however, that the Baptism with the Holy Ghost was to be exclusive with that one group. It was merely the beginning of the Dispensation that was to continue in like manner until the second advent of the Lord when the Dispensation would end, being replaced by the Millennium.

Here is the glowing account of the beginning: Acts 2:1-4.

This same Baptism with the Holy Ghost is for as many as the Lord shall call. He has been calling since the day of Pentecost until now, and will continue to call until the Times of Restitution. You may have this experience yourself, for the Scripture says: Acts 2:38-39.


