A PROMISELAND FOR YOUR KIDS

Willowcreek Community Church, www.willowcreek.org, is one of the largest churches in America with a Children's Ministry, called Promiseland, of over 3500 kids and 1000 children's volunteers each week. Bill Hybels began Willowcreek in the mid 1970's, from a cutting edge youth revival where thousands came to Christ. As a children's pastor, I wanted to find out how Promiseland would work in a Foursquare church. Contacting Foursquare leaders in several churches who use Promiseland, I received some great feedback. Here are some of the questions that I asked:

What do you like about Promiseland?

"it's current," said Linda Westmoreland, Children's Pastor in Moline, Illinois. All of the churches agreed that Promiseland is a very current curriculum including subject matter, video, drama, humor, etc. One children's director really liked the small group format where the message is applied to each child's life.

Does Promiseland work in a Foursquare church? While Promiseland is not a Charismatic or Pentecostal curriculum, none of the Foursquare churches who were surveyed said that they found no conflicting theological opinions in the curriculum. Spiritual ideas like the full armor of God are presented in a very visual way for understanding.

What do you dislike about Promiseland?

Many churches have grade levels structured through sixth grade. If you decide to use Promiseland, which is structured through grade five, you will have to adapt it to fit your sixth graders. Another church mentioned that it might be harder for a "starter" church or a smaller church to use Promiseland, because of the "large group into small group" format.

Would you recommend Promiseland to other Foursquare churches?

Basically all said yes. The only hesitation came from a children's director who made it clear that it takes a dedicated team to facilitate the dramas and small groups.

After visiting Willowcreek myself, I was very impressed with the level of excellence in every detail of their ministry. I walked away with many great ideas. One of them was a concept called experiential learning, where active learning, the use of senses and emotions, are used for high retention. Their style of drama, music and the use of small groups has radically changed and impacted the way we teach our kids here at The Church On The Way.
