

Today, pastors of children and youth, almost with out exception, know exactly "what" and "who" you are talking about. But you may be asking, "What is a tween?" It's the new, hipper version of the old compound word "pre-teen", referring to those 8-12 years of age. Marketers relish the need to give this demographic its own "culturally cool" label because of the shear spending power tweens represent; over 200 billion dollars annually. Teen-ager (another relatively new compound word made popular by the birth of youth culture after WWII) is almost passé. "Tweener" is all the rage. Now I'm sounding (or writing) more like a Madison Avenue trend-scent watchdog than a minister. My motive - to wake us up to the reality, that as Henry Trevor, a middle school director has said, "There is no such thing as a pre-adolescent anymore. Kid's are teenagers at ten."

While the question could be answered in many ways from a spiritual perspective, I believe the answer is found in the testimony of the most famous 12 year old who ever lived, (and still does); His name is Jesus! It has always intrigued me that we have no record of Jesus during the supposed "turbulent teen" years. As a matter of fact, there are no stories about Jesus from shortly after His birth until His baptism at the age of 30 – except for one. Luke chapter 2 shares the story of His trip to Jerusalem with his parents during the feast of the Passover. In Hebrew culture, boys become official members of the community of faith at the ripe age of 12. Jesus was no doubt there for this occasion. During Passover week, things seemed to go smoothly until something went horribly wrong. Mary and Joseph literally lost Jesus. Without realizing it, they had left their tween Son somewhere behind in

Jerusalem. After three days of search and rescue, they finally found Him . . . guess where? Right smack-dab in the temple. He was sitting in the midst of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions. When Mary asked her son why He had done this to them, He responded with 17 words; the first recorded words of Jesus in the Bible: "WHY DO YOU SEEK ME? DID YOU NOT KNOW THAT I MUST BE ABOUT MY FATHER'S **BUSINESS?**"

Jesus' response to Mary indicates He expected her to expect Him to be "where" He was, "doing" what He was doing. For teachers of tweens the implications are nothing short of revolutionary. Could it be that we have underestimated the spiritual capacity and desire of the tween generation? Have we "fun-sized" our programs to accommodate the notion that 21 might be the age of spiritual receptivity, instead of 12? Let's not be a decade late. God the Father captivated God the Son in His own House at the age of 12! IT'S TWEENTIME!

We want to see this change and encourage all of our church leaders to consider how you might reach out to these children.

Children's Ministry Magazine offers some practical ways to minister to children with disabilities:


- Expect appropriate behavior as you would with all your children.
- Gently encourage the child to participate in as many activities as possible.
- If you aren't sure what the child has said, repeat it to confirm that it's correct.
- Check seating arrangements so the child can be as much a part of the group as possible.
- Provide a special restroom break with arrangements made ahead of time for assistance.
- Provide ample time for writing and movement from one place to another.
- Familarize yourself with specialized equipment the child may need.
- Lovingly make the child feel welcome, and encourage the child's parents to continue attending your church.



#### ◆ PROVIDING ENCOURAGEMENT FOR CHILDREN'S LEADERS

The word team is a familiar one, but the concept of team is not always understood. A team is more than a collection of individuals. It is a group of peers who share the same vision and goals, and who embrace the opportunity and responsibility of accomplishing God's direction for ministry. Mike Krzyzewski (Coach K), Duke University Basketball Coach, says in his book, Leading with the Heart, "Great teams embrace responsibility...Believe that the loose ball you're chasing has your name on it." In other words, each individual team member assumes the responsibility for success, no matter if it takes extra effort. "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might" (Eccl. 9:10). Such a group of dedicated individuals makes up our National Children's Ministry Team for Leadership Development. They come from different areas of the country, busy children's pastors and district leaders, willing to give even more of their time and expertise than is already required. They are an awesome group!

In January, our CM Team met in Denver for two intense days and discussed the emerging definition of our team, evaluation (and praise) of our 2004 training events, planning and perspective on 2005 events, and next-step strategies for communication, training, resourcing,

and developing children's ministry leaders and teachers in our districts. (A more detailed report will be sent to our district supervisors soon.) *Our primary goal is to provide a network for each district of leaders who mentor other leaders, especially in the area of Children's Ministry.* In Stanley and Clinton's book, *Connecting*, they underscore an essential mentoring principle (Constellation Model): "A growing leader needs a relational network that embraces mentors, peers, and emerging leaders in order to ensure development and a healthy perspective on his or her life and ministry."


Ministering to children is such a privilege, but the "job" can often be overwhelming. There are many "loose balls" on the field, and we are ready to pick them up and score!

- 5. God wants us to scatter seeds so others will know Him.



#### SCHOOLS: POTENTIAL VENUES OF CONFLICT

According to Peacemaker Ministries, about 4.5 million students attend the 21,000 elementary and secondary private religious schools in the United States, representing approximately eleven percent of our nation's children. Despite the Bible-centered foundation laid in Christian schools, conflicts still occur. The board members, administrators, teachers, parents, and students too easily find themselves in heated, destructive conflict.

In the spirit of maintaining a healthy Christian school environment, we recommend that every administrator and church leader read the book, *The Peacemaker:*

## Truth

Scripture is the revealed Word of God and is taught as truth, which is then integrated into the learning experience.

#### Students are taught that:

- · All truth is God's truth
- · They are created in the image of God
- They must confront the issue of sin and redemption
- They can know God as revealed in Christ and made present through the Holy Spirit

## Intellectual Development

The Christian mind should be the best mind, enlightened by the mind of Christ and one that integrates God's principles with academic pursuits.

The aim is to develop students with a biblical worldview, who are well prepared in all academic disciplines, with an emphasis on:

- · Accurately interpreting the Word of God
- Mastering communication skills
- Showing proficiency in mathematics and science
- Understanding history and God's role in it
- · Appreciating literature and the arts

- · Reasoning and thinking critically
- Finding, analyzing, evaluating, and appropriately using information

### Christian Educators

The Christian school must have a governing body, administration, faculty, and staff who are committed followers of Christ, teaching and leading from a biblically integrated perspective.

## Those engaged with the school's governance, leadership, and teaching will:

- · Model Christ in their teaching and leading
- Reflect and support the school's mission and core values
- Understand and focus on achieving the school's vision and expected outcomes

## **Potential in Christ**

Every learning experience aims to enable students to reach their full potential in Christ.

#### Teaching will include a focus on:

- Providing programs and services appropriate for the student
- Establishing awareness of the student's relationship and responsibility to society

- Developing students intellectually, spiritually, socially, emotionally, and physically through every curricular and cocurricular activity
- Making disciples
- · Preparing for works of service
- · Developing an eternal view of life

## **Operational Integrity**

The school's day-to-day operational practices are a consistent model of integrity, efficiency, and accountability.

## Biblical values are consistently implemented as the school:

- Reflects the high road to policy development and accountability in board governance
- Manages people resources ethically and justly
- Manages and monitors school finances with integrity and disclosure
- Conducts straightforward and Christ–like relations with the government and its agencies
- Creates ethical, clear, and open strategies in development and marketing
- Conducts fair and consistent classroom management
- Reflects honesty, openness, and fairness in parent relations
