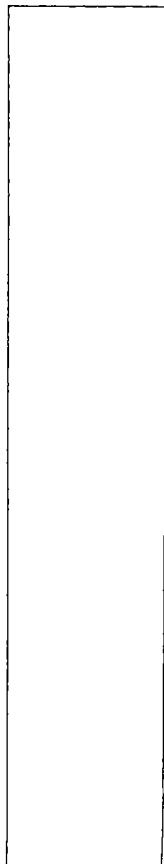
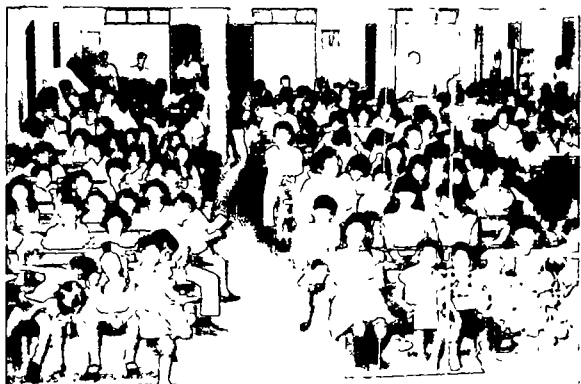

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The above listing shows the order of the segments found on the cassette tape. These segments need not be used in this order. Use them as they best apply to your theme, aim, and particular group setting.

The country where the story occurs is identified in the first few sentences of each segment. The page in this manual which summarizes each segment identifies the storyteller--in each case either one of the missionary wives, a missionary-assistant or the wife of the International Director of Foreign Missions. Identify the speaker as you introduce the story.

Formerly titled "Sunday School Missions Program" these materials have been renamed as the missionary education often occurs other than at Sunday school time. See page 2 for suggested scheduling.

## BEFORE YOU BEGIN

1. Determine your aim for the use of this segment. What do you want the listeners to know, feel, and do as a result? Decide what to emphasize. You may not always want to use the entire segment.
2. Determine how to introduce the segment in the light of the desired response. Adapt the suggested introduction in the manual, or use an entirely different approach. In the same manner decide upon how to conclude the segment. Identify the storyteller.

## GUIDES FOR USE

1. Listen carefully to the segments. The manual gives a summary of each segment, tells the missionary speaking, and from which country the story comes. This information can be mentioned when introducing the segment. Jot down your own thoughts on the sheet as you listen to the cassette portion.
2. Research the countries mentioned. Use the Advance Magazine for further information.
3. Illustrate by use of pictures, artifacts and maps. Appropriate music may be planned.
4. Employ a variety of methods for presentation of these stories. The themes and setting for use will guide your choice. Drama may be employed. Pictures, slides, or art scenes may be shown. Discussion, debate, scripture search, etc. about the topic mentioned in the segment add understanding. Research, projects, and other assignments may be made.
5. The conclusion should always be presented in a life-related manner so that child, adult, and/or youth can identify with the segment in some way--to make a meaningful application to their own lives.
6. Remind the listener each time that the story is a true incident which happened to a Foursquare missionary. Each story shows the power of God at work in the lives of Foursquare missionaries and members. Contend for such working of the Spirit in the lives of those in your church.
7. Allow time for special prayer in behalf of Foursquare missionary work. Designate special needs. Pray for specific missionaries (perhaps those ministering in the country from which the story comes).

The Foursquare World ADVANCE, May, 1972 edition, is a special missionary edition. It lists all of our mission fields and the missionaries who labor there. This special issue arrived in the packet with this manual. Use it often for reference and additional background material for your missionary education program.

SEGMENT 1

COUNTRY: Panama

SPEAKER: Miss Mary Lou Canata

THEME

"Jesus is Healer"

"A God greater than the Witchdoctors"

SUMMARY

The small daughter of Jose Cabraro is bitten by a deadly snake which inhabits the jungles of Panama. Rather than heed the advise of his fellow villagers, Jose and his family believe God to heal little Verna and raise her up. God does not fail; He receives glory through this incident.

INTRODUCTION

The Bible teaches us that Jesus heals the sick when we pray. The missionaries have taught this truth to many people around the world. Now we hear a story about God's healing power.

CONCLUSION

Consider the results if God did not heal the sick. In this case 1) The villagers may have returned to their man-made gods and the witchdoctor; 2) The girl would have died; 3) God's Word would have been doubted.

Hebrews 13:8 reminds us that Jesus does not change and that He will heal the sick as we pray. Believe him for this.

## BILLY'S STRONG FAITH

SEGMENT 2

COUNTRY: Costa Rica

SPEAKER: Mrs. William Pritchett

THEME

"If you believe, you can receive"  
"A miracle healing"

SUMMARY

Billy had polio which caused one leg to be 3" shorter than the other. Billy believed in Jesus even though his parents did not. While attending a special gospel meeting, God healed his leg. Though his parents still did not accept Jesus, Billy continued to serve Him and says someday he wants to be a "Foursquare preacher".

INTRODUCTION

Have you ever wanted something very, very much? Not just a toy or something for fun, but something important--something you really needed? This story is about a little boy named Billy. Billy had a very strong faith for what he needed most.

CONCLUSION

If your need is for healing, as Billy's was, you too can receive it from God. We can always call upon Him for whatever our need might be. John 14:13, 14; James 5:15.

## THE JESUS LADY

SEGMENT 3

COUNTRY: Japan

SPEAKER: Mrs. Jack Francey  
Missionary

THEME

"Only One God--One Way"  
"Children Who Told About Jesus"

SUMMARY

This Foursquare work in Japan began with two little girls who came to the home of the missionary to hear about Jesus. When over one-hundred boys and girls were in attendance the meetings had to be held in another building each week. This Sunday school work resulted in the building of the first Foursquare church in Japan.

INTRODUCTION

1. In this story you will hear about an older lady who added Jesus to her "list of gods!" Through God's Word she learned that there was only one God, Who would not share her love and worship.
2. This story tells how a church was built because two little girls believed on Jesus, and how parents and grandparents became Christians because boys and girls told them the story of Jesus' love.

CONCLUSION

1. Jesus wants us to love Him with all our hearts. If there is something taking His place (first place), we must change it just as the Japanese lady destroyed her idols. Matthew 22:37.
2. Boys and girls in our country can tell others about Jesus just as these Japanese children did. Always remember to pray for other children and adults, and to be faithful to invite them to know Jesus, too.

## A FAITH THAT BROUGHT SUFFERING

SEGMENT 4

COUNTRY: Japan

SPEAKER: Mrs. Jack Francey

THEME

"Counted Worthy to Suffer"  
"Sadness to Joy"

SUMMARY

This story is about a teen-aged girl who was put out of her home because of her faith in Jesus Christ. She sustained beatings at the hand of her father who demanded that she turn from Christianity. She remained faithful and even attended Bible college to prepare for ministry. Eventually her family was won to Jesus because of her faithfulness and love for Jesus.

INTRODUCTION

1. This story is about a teen-aged girl who loved Jesus so much that she was willing to receive unfair punishment for her belief in Him. As you listen note how her love was rewarded.
2. Review the suffering of some Biblical characters (i.e. Job, Jesus, the Apostles, etc.). This story is about a modern-day teenager, living in Japan, who also suffered for Christ's sake. Note the comparison with the previously mentioned persons.

CONCLUSION

1. Do you love Jesus enough to suffer the anger of friends and relatives? Enough to receive beatings?
2. Share these scriptures regarding the suffering of the Christian. What should our attitude be? Acts 5:40,41; 1 Peter 4:13; 2:20; Romans 8:17; 1 Corinthians 13:4; 2 Timothy 2:12.

## A PROMISE KEPT

SEGMENT 5

COUNTRY: Okinawa

SPEAKER: Mrs. Jack Francey

THEME

"Promises, Promises"  
"Go ye. . ."

SUMMARY

Missionaries serve in various types of outreach ministries. Visits to the tuberculosis hospital in Okinawa bore fruit. Listen to this story about Mrs. Takahashi.

INTRODUCTION

The Bible says that it is better not to make a promise than to make one and not keep it. Have you ever broken a promise? This story is about a lady who made a promise to God. Listen to how it changed her life and in turn affected the lives of others.

CONCLUSION

1. Have you ever made a promise to God? Are you keeping it? Sometimes people break promises, but God always keeps His word to us. Share together some of these promises.
2. Because these Okinawan Christians cared enough to visit this tuberculosis hospital souls were won to the Savior. What can we (our group, Sunday school, church) do to reach out with the gospel in our community?

SEGMENT 6

COUNTRY: Guatemala

THEME

Easter

"He is not dead as ye suppose..."

SUMMARY

The Good Friday celebration that takes place in Guatemala is described. For these who do not know Jesus as Savior, the celebration ends with a dead Christ nailed to a cross. They do not know the thrill of a risen Christ of Easter.

INTRODUCTION

As we celebrate Easter our hearts rejoice with the truth that Jesus rose from death. This story about the celebration of Good Friday in Guatemala is tragic. Find out why as you listen.

CONCLUSION

At this season we shall no doubt sing "He Lives". Let us do so with a new gratitude for our living Christ, but at the same time with a prayer for these Guatemalans who only celebrate His death.

## NOT A HASTY DECISION

SEGMENT 7

COUNTRY: Guatemala

SPEAKER: Mrs. Irvin Espeseth  
Missionary

THEME

"Giving That Pays"  
"Reading is Believing"

SUMMARY

Our story illustrates the power of the printed word. Because the missionary was able to give the father the Sunday school literature to study, he made a decision to become a Christian, and the whole family was won.

INTRODUCTION

1. The printed page can convey the power of the Word. This story tells how Sunday school literature helped bring about a decision for Christ, saving an entire family.
2. Through the "giving" of money by Christians at home and in Guatemala, it was possible for our missionary to place Christian literature in the hands of this family. Listen for the result.

CONCLUSION

1. How has reading the Word, or a tract, or other Christian literature influenced you? Share these testimonies.
2. Remember to faithfully give missionary offerings so that others may learn of Jesus. Perhaps a special offering for translations and printed literature might be taken. (Annually the Vacation Bible School missionary offerings have assisted in the translation of Sunday school materials for our Foursquare missionaries.)

THE "FUEGO" OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

SEGMENT 8

COUNTRY: Guatemala

SPEAKER: Mrs. Irvin Espeseth

THEME

"Youth and the *Fuego*"

SUMMARY

Santa Catarina is an Indian village located high on a mountainside in Guatemala. There is an active Foursquare church in this village. The young people play an outstanding role in this church with their many activities, and enthusiastic service to Christ. Victoria and Florinda are two teenagers mentioned for their outstanding experiences.

INTRODUCTION

This is fire in the volcano that overshadows the Indian village mentioned in this story. There is also the fire of the Holy Spirit burning in the lives of the young people. Note their activity for the Lord.

CONCLUSION

1. How can your youth group serve the Lord? What can you do to help?
2. Compare the experiences of Florinda and Victoria with those of young people in your group. God can heal, direct, and use young people wherever they might live.

## A CHILDRENS' REVIVAL?

COUNTRY: Honduras

THEME

Children's Day; VBS; Children's Crusade  
"Children In Revival"

SUMMARY

The Lord laid the burden of a children's revival upon the heart of the missionary. This revival was not only for the children, but was largely advertized and conducted by the children. They participated by giving out many invitations, as choir members, delivering the sermons, and as altar workers. As a result 50 people responded to the invitation on one night.

INTRODUCTION

Honduranian children became very excited about having a revival just for them. With great enthusiasm they advertised the meetings. They also participated most actively in the revival. Note their many activities as you listen.

CONCLUSION

Isn't it wonderful to know how the Lord blessed the efforts of these children in Honduras? The Lord tells us that our hearts should be like that of a child's--soft, believing, and willing. We need to share their enthusiasm for service to the Lord.

## THE ANGEL OF THE MOUNTAIN

SEGMENT 10

COUNTRY: Colombia

SPEAKER: Mrs. John Firth

THEME

"Feed my sheep..."

SUMMARY

This story is about a national pastor who works among the people who live in a high mountain area of Colombia. He travels great distances to minister to these families. One incident is related about how his very life was threatened for the sake of the gospel.

INTRODUCTION

Many are willing to come to church only when all conditions are "go". Some Christians are willing to serve the Lord when it is convenient. As you hear this story you will realize the effort that a national pastor and one Colombian family were willing to expend for the sake of the gospel.

CONCLUSION

Our faithfulness should reflect our thankfulness for the benefits we enjoy in our country. Would we be in church if we had to walk seven hours in order to attend?

## RETURNING GOOD FOR EVIL

SEGMENT 1

COUNTRY: Chile and Argentina

SPEAKER: Mrs. Vinton Johnson

THEME

"Obeying Parents"

SUMMARY

A little Christian girl remains obedient to her parents although they do not know the Lord and refuse to attend church with her. She prayed many nights for their consent to go to Sunday school. Four years later her family moved to Argentina from Chile. Their new house was located next door to the Foursquare church. One by one the whole family was saved.

By the little girl returning good for evil, the neighbor boy, Carlos, his sister, Martha, and their mother all accepted Jesus. This mother also experienced a wonderful healing.

INTRODUCTION

This story is told of a little girl who obeyed her parents even though they did not understand her faith in Jesus, and would not permit her to attend Sunday school for some time.

CONCLUSION

This girl obeyed God when she obeyed her parents. The end result brought her joy when her family did come to know the Lord, too. Review the scriptures regarding the showing of respect to parents and persons older than ourselves.

JUAN DOE AND THE COMIC BOOKS

SEGMENT 2

COUNTRY: Argentina

SPEAKER: Mrs. Vinton Johnson

THEME

"Something of Value"

SUMMARY

This story is about a man whose time was spent selling steel wool or ice cream and reading comic books. He allowed his children to be taken to church by a neighbor where they were saved. Then his wife was saved. In need of healing, Juan asked his neighbor to pray for him. He received the healing and accepted Jesus as his Savior. Now he pastors a church in his home. He still sells steel wool and ice cream, but now reads the Bible instead of comic books.

INTRODUCTION

Selling steel wool, and ice cream and reading comic books took up most of this man's time. When he found Jesus as Savior his life was changed. Listen how.

CONCLUSION

When Jesus came into the life of this man the Bible was substituted for comic books. A life without Him is spent in aimlessness, but Christ brings real value into life.

SEGMENT 3

COUNTRY: Colombia

SPEAKER: Mrs. John Firth

THEME

"Dare To Be a Daniel"  
"God's Protection"

SUMMARY

The "Lion Tamer" is a man 4' 8" tall. He is a Foursquare pastor in a mountain area of Colombia. His congregation is largely made up of former criminals. He was given this title because of an incident which occurred when a lion appeared on the path and would have prevented him from continuing. He did pass by safely in the name of the Lord.

INTRODUCTION

Daniel in the Bible was put into a lions' den but came out unharmed because God protected him. Find out about a Colombian pastor who also met a lion.

CONCLUSION

Just as God protected Daniel, and the "lion tamer" and countless others He will keep us from dangers. He has instructed us not to be afraid, but to trust Him. Review these special scripture verses. Isaiah 41:10; Philippians 4:13; Jeremiah 17:7; Proverbs 18:10.

COUNTRY: Colombia

THEME

"All Things Are Possible"  
"Trust and Obey"

SUMMARY

This is a story about Fernando Fernandez, pastor in Santa Marta, Colombia. God has lead him in unique ways. He was lead to hold a street meeting in a difficult area. The result was that every family on the entire street accepted the Lord Jesus as Savior.

INTRODUCTION

We all have read in the Bible of God's unusual dealings with people such as Moses, Daniel, etc. God had an unusual, difficult task for Fernando Fernandez, pastor in Colombia. His obedience to God's direction resulted in the salvation of many families.

CONCLUSION

Has God ever directed you do an unusual or difficult task? Did you obey? When God directs us, He also makes the way possible, for "all things are possible to him that believes".

THEME

Mother's Day  
Family Emphasis

SUMMARY

The Castros are an unusual Brazilian family. After more than thirty years in another denomination, the father was filled with the Holy Spirit, and became a Foursquare pastor. Mr. Castro's son also was a pastor, as was his daughter, Oda.

Pastor Oda is one of only four lady pastors in all of Brazil. She and her congregation have worked hard, and dared to believe God for the success of the gospel in their community.

INTRODUCTION

You may think that the Castros are an unusual family for several of them have given their lives to the ministry as Foursquare pastors. You will be particularly impressed by Oda, wife of a successful businessman, and mother of four children.

CONCLUSION

God wants every family to serve Him. Each member of His family is important and has a place of service to God. Have you found that place, mother? daughter? father? son?

THEME

Father's Day  
"Thanks be to God, Who gives the victory"

SUMMARY

Spiritism has a strong hold in many countries. Mr. Ramos was one who was deceived by a spiritist doctor who faked his needed surgery. Through the witness of a friend, Mr. Ramos was lead to the Foursquare church where God healed him both physically and spiritually. He now pastors a church in Curitiba, Brazil and is looking forward to its continued growth.

INTRODUCTION

The Bible tells us that Satan is a master deceiver, the very father of lies. For a time a Brazilian father, Mr. Ramos, was a victim of this spiritist deception, but today has victory through the power of the Lord Jesus Christ.

CONCLUSION

Satan is at work in our country as well as Brazil. By the experience of the infilling of the Spirit of God we can experience a victorious life and bring this strong witness to those living around us.

SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

This story is about a "little angel" who loves Jesus Christ, and daily makes it her business to serve Him. Listen to this story about this remarkable child.

CONCLUSION

The true Christian concern for others displayed by this little girl, Angelita, can be a source of inspiration for other children and adults as well. Any life surrendered to Him will bear fruit.

## THE CRAZY MAN

SEGMENT 8

COUNTRY: Chile

SPEAKER: Mrs. Leland Edwards  
Wife of the International Director of Foreign Missions

THEME

"God's Mysterious Ways"  
"Obedience Brings God Glory"

SUMMARY

The Foursquare pastor in Chile recognized God's voice and responds to find himself involved in a very mysterious happening. When God sends this pastor to the "Mad Man" he wonders what the outcome will be. But because of his faithfulness God delivers the man and restores him to his right mind.

INTRODUCTION

Suggest that 2 or 3 tell very briefly how God has spoken to them in unusual ways. Suggest that God does speak through His Word and often guidance is very evident in this way. But at times the Spirit of God witnesses to the Christian's spirit that he is to be directed in a specific way, too.

CONCLUSION

Pray especially for all Foursquare Bible School students in foreign lands. Believe together that they will be obedient to the voice of God in stepping out by faith to accept what He has for them.
